How did the Fund perform last year and what affected its performance?

Although the Fund is not managed relative to any securities market index or benchmark, a discussion of the Fund's performance relative to the MSCI World ex USA Value Index is included for comparative purposes.

Class IV shares of GMO International Opportunistic Value Fund returned +16.23% (net) for the fiscal year ended February 28, 2025, as compared with +15.64% for the MSCI World ex USA Value Index.

Stock selection within sectors drove portfolio outperformance for the period with notable contributions from Financials in Spain, the UK. and France.


Decisions which detracted from performance included overweight positioning in automobile manufacturers and stock selection within Japan and Materials.

Returns include a substantial, one-time litigation settlement recovery received on December 16, 2024. This event contributed 0.48% to the performance for the fiscal year ended February 28, 2025. Performance for other periods including this date was also positively impacted, sometimes materially. Without this recovery, performance would have been lower in both absolute terms and relative to the benchmark. Additional information is available upon request.

Elimination of this reimbursement will result in higher fees and lower performance.
