MAJOR PERFORMANCE DRIVERS

Global equity markets ended the year on a high note, posting solid gains in the fourth quarter. The U.S. underperformed both emerging and developed markets outside the U.S., a trend consistent throughout the year and the quarter. While emerging markets led for the year, developed markets outside the U.S. led for the fourth quarter. Growth was fueled by a mix of drivers, including strong earnings and interest in AI-related stocks, despite ongoing geopolitical and tariff uncertainty.

In this environment, the portfolio underperformed the MSCI ACWI ex Fossil Fuels Index. Portfolio challenges in the quarter included the underperformance of companies with the lowest levels of carbon emissions and those with high levels of green revenues.

Top detractors included stock selection in Health Care, Industrials, and the U.S. Within the U.S., stock selection challenges echoed those of the broader portfolio, including in Information Technology, Health Care, and Industrials.

Despite the broader headwinds, holdings with a combination of high green revenues and lower emissions were among the top contributors, including semiconductor production equipment manufacturer Tokyo Electron (Japan Information Technology) and solar technology manufacturer First Solar (U.S. Information Technology).

The GMO Horizons Investment Fund is a global portfolio reflecting the view that the world economy is transitioning to a lower carbon future, and that this process will create opportunities for investors to seek excess returns. The Fund seeks to capture these opportunities and mitigate related risks through reduced total carbon footprint (direct and indirect) and significant exposure to impactful climate solutions, while controlling for exposure to Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) risks.

The GMO Horizons Investment Fund is a fully systematic and diversified solution that provides:

- Materially lower total emissions than the MSCI ACWI ex-Fossil Fuels Index as measured using scope 1 emissions and GMO's proprietary Indirect Emissions model, which estimates the indirect emissions embodied in end-to-end company value chains
- High levels of exposure to companies where revenue is derived from selling green products and services
- ESG risk mitigation via better ESG characteristics than the benchmark
