

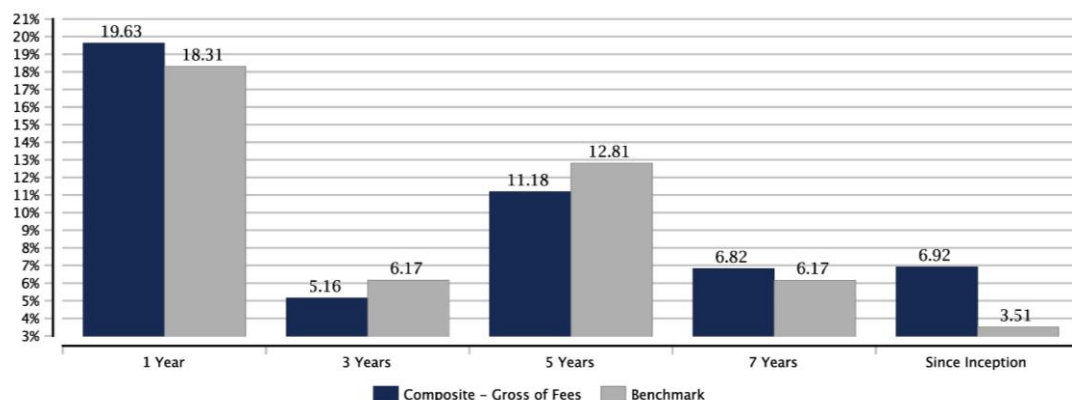

DISCLOSURES

As of 6/30/2021 the standard management fee schedule for the mutual fund in the composite is 75bps on all assets. The annual mutual fund expense ratio for share classes I, II, and V are 109.7bps, 106.7bps, and 93.2bps respectively. The fee schedule includes fees for shareholder services and operating expenses, in addition to the management fees. Other share classes may feature higher or lower fees. Please refer to fund documents for additional information. The standard fee schedule for the UCIT fund in the composite is 97bps on the first \$50M USD, 90bps on the next \$75M USD, 85.5bps on the next \$125M USD, 83.5bps on the next \$150M USD, and 80.5bps thereafter. The annual expense ratio for the standard share class of the UCIT fund is 109.7bps. Some accounts in the composite may have fees that differ from the standard fee schedule and may or may not have performance fees. Please refer to fund documents for additional information. The standard SMA fee schedule for the accounts in the composite is 95bps on the first \$100M USD, 85bps on the next \$100M USD, 60bps on the next \$100M USD, 30bps on the next \$200M USD, and 20bps thereafter.

The Emerging Domestic Opportunities Composite includes portfolios seeking total return by investing in companies that GMO believes will benefit most from the rising demand for goods and services in emerging markets. The strategy employs a fundamental investment approach that combines top-down country and sector allocation with bottom-up security selection. The strategy's investments are not limited to investments in companies located in any particular country or geographic region and may include investments in companies located in emerging markets as well as developed markets (e.g., the U.S.) that are related to, or whose prospects are linked to, emerging markets. The composite was created in April 2011.

The strategy is not limited in its use of derivatives and typically the impact is material. Both the use of derivatives and borrowing may cause a portfolio's gross investment exposure to be in excess of its net assets (i.e., leverage), which may subject a portfolio to a heightened risk of loss. During the period presented the strategy typically used currency forwards, futures, swaps, and rights/warrants.

The internal dispersion of annual gross returns is measured by the equal-weighted standard deviation of account gross returns represented within the composite for the full year. For periods with five or fewer accounts included in the composite for the entire year, 'N/A' is noted as the dispersion is not considered meaningful. The three-year annualized standard deviation measures the variability of the gross composite and benchmark returns over the preceding 36-month period. For periods without 36 months of composite performance history, 'N/A' is provided for both the composite and its benchmark.

Performance results are presented both gross and net of investment advisory fees. The composite results are time-weighted rates of return net of commissions, transaction costs and withholding taxes on foreign income and capital gains. Returns for mutual funds included in the Composite include securities lending income, if applicable. Valuations and returns are calculated and expressed in U.S. dollars. All composite returns reflect the reinvestment of dividends and other earnings. Gross returns do not reflect the deduction of investment advisory fees or any other expenses that may be incurred in the management of this account. Effective January 1, 2014 net composite returns are calculated using a model advisory fee by applying the current highest fee to the composite's gross-of-fee returns on a monthly basis. Prior to January 1, 2014 net returns were calculated by applying the account's actual fee schedule in effect for the respective period on a monthly basis for each account in the composite. The model advisory fee is the higher of the maximum standard fee charged to separate accounts, without taking into account any applicable breakpoints, or the highest fee paid by any account in the composite. Actual fees paid may be higher or lower than model advisory fees.

The MSCI Emerging Markets Index is a free float-adjusted market capitalization index that is designed to measure equity market performance in the global emerging markets. This unmanaged market index is provided to represent the investment environment existing during the time periods shown. The index does not reflect the deduction of advisory fees. The index used by this composite is calculated net of dividend withholding, it approximates the minimum possible dividend reinvestment. The dividend is reinvested after deduction of withholding tax, applying the rate to non-resident individuals who do not benefit from double taxation treaties. MSCI uses withholding tax rates applicable to Luxembourg holding companies, as Luxembourg applies the highest rates. It is not possible to invest directly in the index. The MSCI Emerging Markets Index is monitored and maintained by the vendor, Morgan Stanley Capital International Inc.
