Objectives and Investment Policy

The fund aims to achieve positive returns.

The fund will invest primarily in shares and related securities of companies whose prospects are linked to the internal development and growth of emerging market countries. Emerging market countries are those excluded from the MSCI World Index or those included in the S&P/IFC (Investable) Composite Index or such other countries the investment manager deems to be emerging market countries. The fund may also invest in other investment funds to pursue the investment objective of this fund.

In evaluating and selecting investments, the investment manager may consider many factors, including the investment manager's assessment of a country's and/or sector's fundamentals or growth prospects as well as a company's positioning relative to its competitors. The fund's investments are not limited to investments in companies located in any particular country or geographic region, and may include investments in companies located in developed markets whose prospects are linked to emerging market countries.

The fund is actively managed and does not manage the fund to, or control the fund's risk relative to, any securities index or securities benchmark. The fund uses the MSCI Emerging Markets Index for performance comparison purposes only (the "Comparator Index").

Although the fund's securities may be components of the Comparator Index, the fund's investment manager may or may not invest in securities not included in the Comparator Index.

The fund may use instruments whose value is determined by changes in the value of the underlying assets they represent (derivatives). Derivatives may be used for investment purposes and for the reduction of risk and cost and the generation of additional capital or income.

You may usually sell your shares on each business day (generally a day on which banks in Dublin and London and the New York Stock Exchange are open) by sending your request to State Street Fund Services (Ireland) Limited before 2.00 pm (Irish time) on the preceding business day.

Income is reinvested into the fund.

Risk and Reward Profile



The risk category is estimated based on simulated and historical data and may not be a reliable indicator of the future risk profile of the fund. The risk category shown is not guaranteed and may change over time.

The numerical scale is complex. For example, 2 is not twice as risky as 1. The gap between 1 and 2 might not be the same as the gap between 5 and 6. A category 1 fund is not a risk-free investment – the risk of losing your money may be small, but the chance of making gains is also limited.

The fund is in category 5 because it invests in shares in companies exposed to emerging market countries so historically these has been a greater fluctuation in the price of the shares of such investments than the investments of other funds (such as money market funds).

Risks materially relevant to the fund which may not be adequately captured by the indicator:

The fund may not achieve its investment objective and the value of shares in the fund may fall.

The fund shall invest significantly in companies exposed to emerging market countries. Such investments will be subject to greater risk due to political, economic, corporate governance, legal, market, accounting and other risks.

Assets may not be properly held in custody and, as a result, may be lost. It may be more difficult to sell assets at a fair price in emerging markets.

Low trading volume, lack of a market maker, large size of position or legal restrictions may limit or prevent the fund from selling securities or unwinding derivative positions at desirable prices.

Geopolitical and other events may disrupt markets and adversely affect global economies and markets. Those events as well as other changes in foreign and domestic economic and political conditions could adversely affect the value of the fund's investments.

Fluctuations in exchange rates can adversely affect the market value of the fund's foreign currency holdings and investments denominated in foreign currencies.


