

U.S. SMALL CAP VALUE FUND

Quarterly Investment Review

PRODUCT OVERVIEW

The GMO U.S. Small Cap Value Fund seeks to generate total return in excess of its benchmark, the S&P Small Cap 600 Value Index, by investing primarily in equities of U.S. companies that are included in the S&P 600 Index or whose market capitalization at the time of investment is less than that of companies in the bottom decile of market capitalization of the MSCI U.S. IMI Index.

The Fund's investment approach is grounded in the Systematic Equity team's belief that, in the short term, equity markets exhibit exploitable inefficiencies as a result of irrational investor actions, the imperfect flow of information, and the participation of non-economic actors, while in the long-term returns are ultimately driven by economic reality. The Fund aims to take advantage of these inefficiencies by utilizing a multi-factor valuation model in conjunction with other methods, such as momentum and corporate alerts, to identify undervalued equity securities.

MAJOR PERFORMANCE DRIVERS

Global equity markets continued to deliver positive absolute returns across regions amid enthusiasm for AI infrastructure and strong outperformance from the Information Technology sector. This market strength persisted despite ongoing disruptions in the trade of energy, commodities, and other critical products from the Middle East. In this environment, the Energy sector underperformed after having rallied in March amid the Iran conflict.

The S&P SmallCap 600 Index outperformed larger-cap U.S. names again in the second quarter, but small value underperformed small growth. In this environment, the portfolio outperformed. While the outperformance of stocks we determined to be expensive was a headwind, momentum models performed well, and companies identified as potential value traps underperformed.

Highlights for the quarter included a mix of sector allocation and stock selection decisions in Financials, Energy, and Materials. Within Financials, Consumer Finance stock selection was a highlight, including overweight positioning in top contributor Enova International. While the portfolio's average weight in Energy was in line with the benchmark in the second quarter, the portfolio had moved to underweight in June ahead of sector underperformance, which complemented strong stock selection. Not holding Celanese Corporation on a mix of poor Momentum and negative Alerts also contributed to outperformance in the Materials sector.

In contrast, the largest challenges came from stock selection in Information Technology and Consumer Staples. Within Information Technology, semiconductor stock selection was the biggest detractor, including holding attractively valued Photronics instead of the expensive MaxLinear, which had strong Momentum scores.

Portfolio weights, as a percent of equity, for the positions mentioned were: Photronics (1.9%) and MaxLinear (0.0%)
