Without this recovery, performance would have been lower in both absolute terms and relative to the benchmark. Additional information is available upon request. Returns reflect a significant, one-time increase to the net assets on November 26, 2025 attributable to European Union discriminatory tax refunds. These refunds contributed 1.12% to 2025 annual performance. Returns for other periods that include the date/period mentioned above were also positively impacted, sometimes substantially. In the absence of the refunds, performance would have been lower, both in absolute terms and relative to the benchmark. Additional information is available upon request.

MAJOR PERFORMANCE DRIVERS

- Top-down asset allocation was positive. The headline positions of emphasizing developed ex-U.S. and emerging market equities over U.S. equities, along with emphasizing value equities over growth equities, both worked for the quarter.
 - Security selection was also positive for the quarter, driven by excellent results across the U.S., developed ex-U.S., and emerging market exposures.
- Emerging Market equities, with an emphasis on undervalued stocks within attractively valued countries and sectors, represented 13.3% of the total portfolio weight on average during the quarter. The portfolio was modestly overweight Emerging Market equities relative to the benchmark, which added marginally to relative performance as the MSCI Emerging Markets Index returned 4.7%, ahead of the MSCI ACWI return of 3.3%. Security selection was solid, as the portfolio returned 7.7% in aggregate. An underweight position in SK Hynix (Korea Information Technology) featured in the top five biggest individual detractors from relative performance for the quarter, while no Emerging Market names appeared among the top five contributors.

MAJOR PERFORMANCE DRIVERS CONT.

U.S. equities accounted for 41.9% of the total portfolio on average through the quarter, comprising 3.0% in U.S. Small Cap Value equity, 4.0% in U.S. Small Cap Quality equity, 10.1% in broad U.S. equity, 12.7% in U.S. Opportunistic Value equity, 1.8% in a new U.S. Domestic Resilience position, and the remainder in the Quality and Resources strategies. This leaves the portfolio 22.5% underweight U.S. equities overall, and this had a positive impact on relative performance for the quarter as the MSCI USA Index returned 2.3%, underperforming MSCI ACWI. Security selection in the U.S. was strong, as the portfolio returned 5.3% in aggregate. Underweight positions in Microsoft (Information Technology), Oracle (Information Technology), and NVIDIA (Information Technology) featured in the top five biggest individual contributors to relative performance for the quarter. On the flipside, underweight positions in Alphabet (Communication Services), Eli Lilly (Health Care), and Micron Technology (Information Technology) featured in the top five biggest individual detractors from relative performance for the quarter.

Developed ex-U.S. equities accounted for an average weight of 43.4% of the portfolio for the quarter, including 23.7% in Developed ex-U.S., 11.0% in International Opportunistic Value, 5.9% in Japan Fundamental Value, along with some exposure from the Quality and Resources strategies. This overweight position in Developed ex-U.S. had a positive impact on relative performance as the MSCI World ex-USA Index returned 5.2%, ahead of MSCI ACWI. Security selection within developed markets was strong, as the portfolio returned 6.6% in aggregate. Overweight positions in Nokia (Finland Information Technology) and Banco Bilbao (Spain Financials) featured in the top five biggest individual contributors to relative performance for the quarter, while an overweight position in 3i Group (United Kingdom Financials) featured among the top five biggest individual detractors from relative performance.

Portfolio weights, as a percent of equity, for the positions mentioned were: SK Hynix (0.0%), Microsoft (1.5%), Oracle (0.1%), NVIDIA (0.6%), Alphabet (1.6%), Eli Lilly (0.2%), Micron Technology (0.1%), Nokia (0.6%), Banco Bilbao (1.1%), and 3i Group (0.6%).

Our approach combines the best of GMO's top-down Asset Allocation views and bottom-up equity research to identify mispricings at both the asset class and individual security levels. The Fund allocates to equity strategies that are actively managed by other GMO investment teams with expertise and experience in security selection within their respective markets.
