

REAL RETURN GLOBAL BALANCED ASSET ALLOCATION STRATEGY

Quarterly Investment Review

PRODUCT OVERVIEW

The GMO Real Return Global Balanced Asset Allocation Strategy seeks to generate total return greater than that of its benchmark of 60% MSCI World Index, 20% Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Index, and 20% FTSE 3-Month Treasury Bill Index by allocating dynamically across asset classes. The Strategy invests in actively managed equity, fixed income, alternative, and cash strategies, as well as a GMO-managed diversified liquid alternatives mutual fund, which seeks positive total return with low volatility relative to equity markets and low correlation over a full market cycle to traditional market indices.

The philosophy that underlies all of GMO's Asset Allocation investment strategies is the belief that, at times and in the short term, the pricing of asset classes can deviate from true intrinsic value, but mean reverts to appropriate valuation levels over the long term. GMO's proprietary 7-Year Asset Class Forecasts form the foundation of our investment process, providing a framework to assess the return opportunity embedded in different asset classes. We use that insight to allocate to what we believe are the most attractively priced asset classes. GMO's Asset Allocation approach is flexible, not pre-determined by static allocations or benchmark-related ranges, constrained only by our unwillingness to overpay for an asset. We also seek to add value through security selection within both traditional and alternative asset classes.

MAJOR PERFORMANCE DRIVERS

Equities represented an average of 58.6% of the portfolio during the quarter, including 6.4% in Emerging Markets, 2.1% in Emerging Markets ex-China, 14.5% in Developed ex-U.S., 3.1% in Quality, 6.2% in U.S., 1.9% in U.S. Small Cap Quality, 7.1% in U.S. Opportunistic Value, 6.0% in Japan Fundamental Value, 7.0% in International Opportunistic Value, 2.2% in Resource equity, and 2.1% in U.S. Domestic Resilience.

The equity portfolio returned 14.4% for the quarter, ahead of the MSCI World return of 13.8%. Top-down allocations were unhelpful as the U.S. strongly outperformed developed ex-USA, although this was somewhat offset by an excellent return from emerging markets, while value also underperformed growth for the quarter. Security selection was strongly positive for the quarter. The Emerging Market portfolio returned 30.3%, which was 620 bps ahead of the MSCI Emerging Markets Index, and Emerging Markets ex-China returned 38.6%, which was 410 bps ahead of the MSCI Emerging Markets ex-China Index return of 34.5%. In Developed ex-U.S. markets, the portfolio posted 14.8%, which was 460 bps ahead of the MSCI World ex-USA Index, and International Opportunistic Value posted 5.5%, underperforming the MSCI World ex-USA Value Index by 260 bps. In the U.S., the broad U.S. portfolio return of 17.1% beat the S&P Composite 1500 by 180 bps, while the U.S. Opportunistic Value return of 6.4% underperformed the MSCI USA Value Index by 340 bps, and Quality lagged the S&P 500 by 110 bps. Resource equity comfortably outperformed its reference benchmark, while U.S. Small Quality and Domestic Resilience underperformed. The Japan Value portfolio returned 16.2%, ahead of the TOPIX by 420 bps. Our underweight exposure to equities had a small negative impact on performance relative to the asset allocation benchmark.

Fixed income represented 8.9% on average through the quarter, including 0.9% in Emerging Country Debt and 7.9% in U.S. Treasury notes. Our fixed income strategies returned -1.8% for the quarter, behind the Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Index return of 0.7%. The U.S. Treasury exposure did poorly, posting -2.8%. Our Emerging Country Debt portfolio returned 7.1%, which was ahead of the EMBI Global Diversified Index return of 4.6%. Our underweight exposure to fixed income had a positive impact on performance against the asset allocation benchmark.

Cash/Cash Plus and Alternatives represented 32.6% on average through the quarter, including 13.6% in Equity Dislocation, 15.8% in Alternative Allocation, and 3.2% in Cash and Short Duration. Equity Dislocation returned -0.4%, far ahead of the MSCI ACWI Value minus MSCI ACWI Growth comparator of -9.2%. The Alternative Allocation strategy posted a return of -2.6% for the quarter, behind the returns of both world equities and bonds. Within the Alternative Allocation strategy, each of Systematic Global Macro, World Market Neutral, and Equity Dislocation detracted from performance. Our overweight exposure to alternatives negatively impacted relative performance, as they underperformed the asset allocation benchmark.

This event contributed 0.90% to 2024 annual performance, based on a representative account. Performance for other periods, including this date, was also positively impacted, sometimes materially. Without this recovery, performance would have been lower in both absolute terms and relative to the benchmark. Additional information is available upon request. Returns reflect a significant, one-time increase to the net assets on November 26, 2025 attributable to European Union discriminatory tax refunds. These refunds contributed 0.65% to 2025 annual performance, based on a representative account. Returns for other periods that include the date/period mentioned above were also positively impacted, sometimes substantially. In the absence of the refunds, performance would have been lower, both in absolute terms and relative to the benchmark. Additional information is available upon request.
