

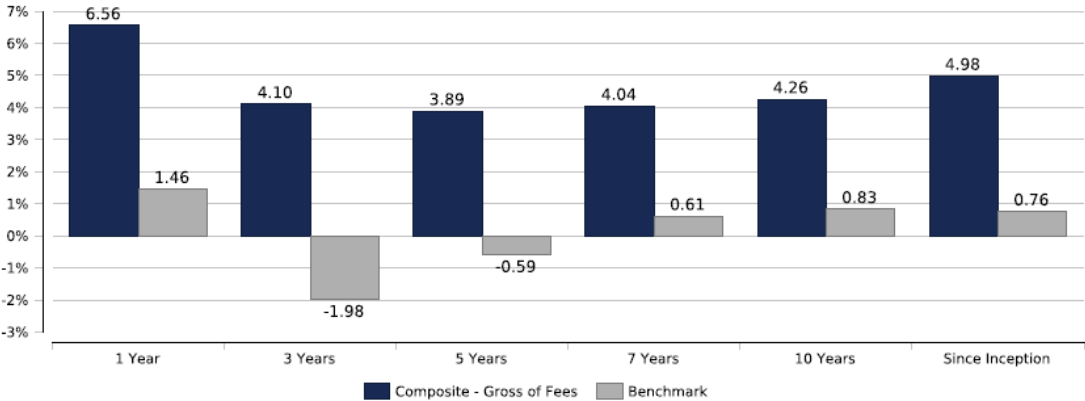

## DISCLOSURES

As of 6/30/2025, the standard management fee schedule for the mutual fund in the composite is 40bps on all assets. The annual total expense ratio for share class I is 70bps. The expense ratio includes fees for shareholder services and operating expenses, in addition to the management fees. Other share classes may feature higher or lower fees. Please refer to fund documents for additional information. The standard fee schedule for an SMA in the composite is 60bps on the first \$50M and 55bps thereafter.

The Opportunistic Income Composite includes portfolios seeking capital appreciation and current income by investing primarily in what we believe are the most attractively priced sectors and securities in the structured finance marketplace without constraints related to asset class, credit rating, duration, or yield targets. GMO emphasizes issue selection in its investment process, which involves examination. The strategy plans to have substantially all of its assets denominated in, or hedged into, U.S. dollars. Prior to January 2017, this composite was known as Debt Opportunities Composite. The composite was created in November 2011.

The strategy is not limited in its use of derivatives and typically the impact is material. Both the use of derivatives and borrowing may cause a portfolio's gross investment exposure to be in excess of its net assets (i.e., leverage), which may subject a portfolio to a heightened risk of loss. During the period presented the strategy typically used currency forwards, futures, swaps, and swaptions.

The internal dispersion of annual gross returns is measured by the equal-weighted standard deviation of account gross returns represented within the composite for the full year. For periods with five or fewer accounts included in the composite for the entire year, 'N/A' is noted as the dispersion is not considered meaningful. The three-year annualized standard deviation measures the variability of the gross composite and benchmark returns over the preceding 36-month period. For periods without 36 months of composite performance history, 'N/A' is provided for both the composite and its benchmark.

Performance results are presented both gross and net of investment advisory fees. The composite results are time-weighted rates of return net of commissions, transaction costs and withholding taxes on foreign income and capital gains. Returns for mutual funds included in the Composite include securities lending income, if applicable. Returns for private funds included within the composite, if any, are net of any private fund operating expenses. Valuations and returns are calculated and expressed in U.S. dollars. All composite returns reflect the reinvestment of dividends and other earnings. Effective January 1, 2014 net composite returns are calculated using a model advisory fee by applying the highest fee schedule to the composite's gross-of-fee returns on a monthly basis. Prior to January 1, 2014 net returns were calculated by applying the account's actual fee schedule in effect for the respective period on a monthly basis for each account in the composite. Actual fees paid by any individual investor may be higher or lower than model advisory fees.

The Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Securitized: MBS, ABS, CMBS Index is comprised of the securitized credit portion of the Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Index.
